"Darkness and Light" | Rev. Dr. Rich Jones

"The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned."

Matthew 4:16, NRSV

Darkness to Light. Birth to life to death to resurrection.

Gardening is such a powerful metaphor for our lives. When you garden, you get messy, dirty. You dig deep and plant seeds into moist, rich, and dark soil. In that darkness, life is seeded, and begins to grow, drawing nourishment from the messy, but rich soil filled with nutrients. That life grows upwards towards the light, while also growing downwards to bring up nutrients to feed life heading towards the light that will cause it to blossom.

For life to come forward, it takes a while. A season. I love this time of the year because it's at the end of the seasonal life cycle. Things are dying, leaves falling, there is color, but it's also a time of shedding, of loss, and movement towards winter.

Winter is where things lie dormant, dead, and become compost to give nourishment for new life coming forth in the spring.

This is the cycle of life. In our modern, post-modern world, we want to try and to deny this cycle, but we cannot. It just does not happen. And, when we do, it causes so much disruption.

I believe that our society, in its current way of being, has tried to live in denial of this rhythm. It's why we have so much deep dissonance and division. We try to control things. We try to live

as if we are above this rhythm of life, and we become robbed of any sense of growth or contentment in life with ourselves, others, and God.

Into this season culturally, we find the universal church also trying to deny this rhythm, this cycle, and we are missing out on the fullness of life that each season brings.

It is hard, life is changing, disruptions and loss seem all around us.

Yet, at Westwood First Presbyterian, we have embraced this cycle of life. Our Presbyterian roots in the Church of Scotland and even beyond the formation of the Presbyterian Church gives us a symbol this cycle of life. Our Celtic Christian ancestors gave us the symbol of the Celtic Cross, that we see in every Presbyterian Church, when they put the circle on the Roman cross. To them, the Roman cross was a symbol of violence by the Roman Empire. The circle represents life, death, birth, the seasons, and a deep sense of oneness and presence that puts the violence of the cross into perspective.

As we, Westwood First Presbyterian, embrace this deeper reality, we are seeing all sorts of seeds being planted in our weekly worship services, our music program, our spiritual formation through Westside Abbey, our community engagement through the Westwood Common Good Project, our young adult connection, congregational life, our staff, our session, our mission engagement, and our building! And the list could go on! Seeds that are being planted, that have experienced darkness and cultivation, and through the gifts of folks in and around Westwood First, through donations, grants, and our "regular" church stewardship, are seeing so much deeper growth and abundant fruit.

When you read this, I will be on our pilgrimage to lona with folks from our congregation and folks from the community that have come to Westwood First through the Westside Abbey. I am at peace. Real peace. Peace deeper than

PER CAPITA UPDATE

Per Capita is due in November

As a member church of the Presbytery of Cincinnati, Westwood First pays a per capita fee for each member in November. This year, the amount we owe is \$5,320, with a per capita fee of \$35 for our 152 members (as of 2023).

To date, members have only contributed \$1,740. So, we will need to make up the balance from other operating funds.

In the Presbytery of Cincinnati, the per capita apportionment helps cover essential operating expenses, including administrative costs, staff salaries, insurance, legal services, the annual audit, and committee support. A portion goes to General Assembly. The Presbytery provides many services to the member churches, including guidance, training, information sharing, and grants.

This year, WFPC has received \$28,000 from Presbytery to host the Soul Place and provide funding for our community outreach and youth efforts.

If you have not paid your Per Capita fee, please do so before November.

CONGREGATIONAL LIFE

ALL SAINTS SUNDAY - SUNDAY NOVEMBER 2, 2025

In early Christian tradition, saints' days began as a way to mark the anniversary of a martyr's death — his or her "birthday" as a saint. By the middle of the church's first millennium, there were so many martyrs (particularly due to the persecution of Diocletian) that it was hard to give them all their due. All Saints' Day was established as an opportunity to honor all the saints, known and unknown.

All Saints' Day has a rather different focus in the Reformed tradition. While we may give thanks for the lives of particular luminaries of ages past, the emphasis is on the ongoing sanctification of the whole people of God. Rather than putting saints on pedestals as holy people set apart in glory, we give glory to God for the ordinary, holy lives of the believers in this and every age. This is an appropriate time to give thanks to members of the community of faith who have died in the past year. We also pray that we may be counted among the company of the faithful in God's eternal realm.

All Saints' Day has been celebrated on November 1 since the year 835.
