Matthew 14:15-21 15 When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." 16 Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." 17 They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." 18 And he said, "Bring them here to me." 19 Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves. and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. 20 And all ate and were filled: and they took up what was

left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. 21 And those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

Friends, I wrote much of this article a few years ago, but it seems like every year we have faced uncertainty in our personal, communal, and public lives. Uncertainty in every area of life it seems. This year, we still face uncertainty, don't we? We have adjusted and adapted and our church continues to grow deeper in so many ways. And, we have seen God provide for us, and for those around us, in so many ways.

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE (CONT.)

It reminds me of how we, in the church, often ask, what are our needs or even the needs of those around us? Sometimes those are good to identify, but there is a deeper question to ask, what are we aiming for? Who are we? What do we have already? How can we be trustful in the moment of history that we find ourselves? I think those questions are exemplified in the feeding of the 5000. Jesus knows that folks need to be fed, but instead of asking how do we get to another place, he simply says, what do we have? Jesus sees the assets and gifts of the people, then he uses those assets to bless the people gathered.

Which is what Jesus is driving his listeners towards. In a different gospel, the disciples keep on asking questions and go to the place of trying to connect Jesus' feeding of the 5000 to Moses providing Manna from heaven. Moses' Manna lasted for 40 years, and then another 40, and helped the Jewish population stay alive physically, but the point of that is that it came from heaven. God provided through Moses. Jesus says in the gospel of John, God has given them, and us, the true bread from heaven, that gives life to the world, everyone. God's self in Jesus.

Jesus is coming to us with the promise of Presence, of relationship. A promise that he will be with us, even in the darkness of our lives. He doesn't promise some self-help technique, a slogan, an easy fix, an ideology, or a political party, he simply gives us relationship and promises of never leaving or forsaking us through the universal presence of the Christ. Jesus does not want us to fill our lives with the bad carbs, but the good carbs that he is giving us. He knows that he, like us, need time to ourselves, but that we can't forget that we are connected to the world, and that we are the body of Christ, bread for the world.

Jesus is the bread of life, and that bread starts with yeast rising. That yeast has been planted in this world through God's Spirit, entering humanity, being one with us.

God's Spirit is also moving in and through us like yeast in dough. We're being molded and

moved around, it's sometimes a bit awkward, but that yeast is working its way through the dough and Christ is rising up within us and around us. And, as that yeast grows and takes shape in us and around us, we begin to realize that we can confront the issues of our day personally and in our communities, that we can have hard conversations, listen, grow, and love well. I am so grateful for our church's involvement in our local community in so many ways! Friends, as we walk together through this season of uncertainty, may we remember that we are the body of Christ together, bread for the world, and that we can draw our sustenance from a God who does provide and is working with us in this season that we find ourselves giving us new practices and new ways of being.


# Adopt a Spot: Saturday September 27th
