# PASTOR'S MESSAGE (CONT.)

It doesn't matter what our political or religious persuasions may have been, the amount of change in a short time has left us disoriented and not sure what to think or react. As we hear the heated cultural and political rhetoric, the lament of our Black and Brown and Asian brothers and sisters, the immigrant and the ones on the margins, and the violence that begets violence. We either react in anger, retreat, or we face it with curiosity and with a deeper trust that works towards deeper understanding and awareness.

On top of that, our own lives don't seem to pause much, we have personal changes in our local relationships and within us! It's important to note that the changes in culture, and in us, cause us to reflect personally and in our communities, but also in our institutions, businesses, churches, professions, etc.

In times of change, we can trust that God is with us. That trust leads us into deeper places within ourselves and our relationships with others.

At Westwood First Presbyterian, we are not oblivious to the cultural and personal changes happening around us and within us. We are having "brave conversations" with one another and demonstrating a deep trust that is giving us strength to face the changes in and around us. It is not a "blind trust", but a trust given with eyes wide

open...eyes open to seeing one another as humans made in the image of God and not as objects to be used or thrown away. And, as my friend Cormac Russell says, we "grow as fast as the speed of trust"...well, it is evident at WFPC that we have the trust and we are growing in deeper and different ways than we could have ever expected!

The Hebrew word "Hesed" is found throughout Scripture describing God. It means unfailing love, compassion, trust/faith, and intense loyalty to community.

May we continue to trust God's "hesed" by continuing to live in authentic, humble, honoring, and faithful community/relationships with each other, especially as we live into changing times and experience new wisdom and growth in ourselves and in our church.

### **MISSION & OUTREACH**

### Our Daily Bread - Volunteers Needed for "Sandwich Squad"!

Jesus said, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" Matthew 4:4 (New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition).

Our Daily Bread is Cincinnati's largest non-profit soup kitchen and social center located in the Overthe-Rhine neighborhood of downtown Cincinnati. Their mission is to provide stability and hope to guests in need by offering meals, hospitality and social services in a safe, respectful environment. In 2024, 199,842 meals were served with the help of volunteers posting 21,184 volunteer hours.

The social center serves as a community gathering place where guests are welcome to relax and socialize, earning the nickname "Cincinnati's living room." Guests are welcome to participate in various activities such as playing bingo or card games, enjoying a movie or simply having a safe place to rest. Other amenities open to the public include public restrooms, water-bottle filling station, free phone access for local calls, free Wi-Fi, chairs, couches, and mats for a resting place, outlets to charge phones/ devices and a bag check to keep their belongings safe. Birthdays are even celebrated with a take home treat bag.

In 2024, the soup kitchen served 199,842 meals and this year has seen record numbers, reaching 800+ meals a day on occasion. All food that is served is either rescued or donated. In addition to serving dine-in and carry-out hot meals Monday through Friday, sandwiches and snacks are provided to guests so that they may have something to eat later in the day. THIS IS WHERE YOU COME IN!







As many of you may recall, there once was a "sandwich squad" of dedicated volunteers from Westwood First who made sandwiches every Thursday to be delivered to Our Daily Bread during COVID and post-COVID times. Unfortunately, the need has only grown since that time so we thought we would like to rejuvenate our efforts to provide sandwiches once again. We will be seeking at least 10 volunteers to make 20 sandwiches each (or you can partner with someone and do 10 each). They are simple sandwiches of just bread and meat of your choice sealed in an individual plastic bag and labeled (no cheese on sandwiches due to allergy concerns, but may provide a pre-wrapped slice of cheese in the baggie, not on the sandwich). We are hoping this provides a volunteer opportunity for all since this can be done in the comforts of your own home. Our first sandwich donation date is **WEDNESDAY, MAY 21**st. All sandwiches would need to be delivered to church that morning between 8:00 am and 9:00 am (they need to be delivered to Our Daily Bread by 10:00 am). Arrangements can be made if you are unable to deliver at that exact hour). **A sign-up sheet with all the details will be in the parlor for all who are interested.** Future dates will be added throughout the year to give everyone the opportunity to participate. ### **East Westwood Grocery Update**

In the aftermath of the January 15th food mart fire in East Westwood, the WFPC Mission & Outreach Committee has been working with Third Presbyterian Church and the East Westwood Community Council to help the residents of East Westwood most impacted by the fire.

One of the ideas brought forward was tap into the Healthy Harvest Mobile Market operated by the Freestore Foodbank. They have agreed to include East Westwood into their schedule and the mobile market will be appearing there May 19, June 30, and July 21. Exact times, locations, and need for any other volunteers is still being worked out.

This is a great win for East Westwood and a step in the right direction in addressing the food desert in the neighborhood! We'll keep you updated on any further developments.
